Mountain View was designated a silver-level Bicycle Friendly Community this Fall by the League of American Bicyclists, an upgrade from the bronze-level award



the City has held since 2004. The silver-level award recognizes the City's commitment to improving conditions for bicycling through investment in bicycling promotion, education programs, infrastructure and pro-bicycling policies. Mountain View is one of only 242 communities across the country to be designated as a Bicycle Friendly Community.

The City's efforts to promote cycling include investing in a comprehensive bicycle network of trails, bike lanes, bike routes and bike boulevards. Mountain View has also provided downtown bike lockers, racks and a rent-free bicycle shelter at the Downtown Mountain View Transit Center. Recently, the City completed extensions of the Stevens Creek Trail and Permanente Creek Trail, enabling bicyclists to cross highways 237, 101 and 85.
