

The City is expected to complete work on Reach 4, Segment 1 of the Stevens Creek Trail by this fall. This half-mile section of the Trail runs from Landels School to Yuba Drive and allows trail users to go under the Highway 85 on-ramp and over Highway 237.

The Stevens Creek Trail is a pedestrian and bike trail running along Stevens Creek in Mountain View that is used by more than 1,000 people each day for recreation and commuting.

Reach 4, Segment 2 of the Trail, a 1.7-mile section that would run from Yuba Drive to Mountain View High School, is currently under study by the City. The proposed plan for the next segment would create an asphalt paved path that would link residential areas east of Route 85 to schools and neighborhoods on the west side of Route 85, providing additional commute and recreation options for bikers and hikers.

The City is in the process of developing the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) on the proposed segment. A draft EIR was prepared this summer.

The next step is for the City to complete compiling public responses to the draft EIR and make amendments to the draft. Late in the fall, the final EIR will be prepared and reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Commission and then the City Council. The Council is expected to approve the final EIR sometime in November or December 2002
