

The City is in the process of completing the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the final section of the Stevens Creek Trail in Mountain View. Reach 4, Segment 2 will be 1.7 miles long and run from Yuba Drive to Mountain View High School.

Stevens Creek Trail is a bike and pedestrian trail that connects many of the City's park, recreation and open space facilities. It is used by more than 1,000 people each day for recreation and commuting. Currently, trail users can travel from Shoreline at Mountain View Park along San Francisco Bay to the El Camino Real area. This final section will extend the trail to Mountain View High School.

The Draft EIR for Reach 4, Segment 2 was released in July, 2002 and followed by a 45-day period for public comment. Based on these comments, revisions were made to design plans. This spring, staff will meet with permitting agencies and organizations to review the revisions. A final EIR is expected by early summer and will be reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Commission. It is expected to go to the City Council for review and certification late this summer.
